Comedian May Buy KDKA Parent Firm

Pros from Hollywood to Wall Street have been stunned by the proposal of Allen Media Group to combine with Paramount Global.

Paramount's assets include two major Pittsburgh television stations, primarily KDKA-TV. Allen Media Group (formerly called Entertainment Studios) is the privately held firm founded by comedian Byron Allen in 1993. As a performer, Allen is best known for his stint as a cohost of the television series "Real People" (1979-1984). The company initially just produced talk and courtroom shows for syndication. But the ambitious and astute Allen grew the firm to now include premier assets such as The Weather Channel. This has made Byran Allen part of the small echelon of African American media tycoons that include Oprah Winfrey and Tyler Perry.

"Mr. Byron Allen did submit a bid on behalf of Allen Media Group and its strategic partners to purchase all of Paramount Global's

out-



standing shares," *The Hollywood* <u>Reporter's</u> Alex Weprin quote an official statement. "We believe this \$30 billion offer, which includes debt and equity, is the best solution for all of the Paramount Global shareholders, and the bid should be taken seriously and pursued." The "strategic partners" were not identified.

According to a report written by Jill Goldsmith for <u>Deadline</u>, the proposal would have Allen Media

Group (AMG) assuming Paramount Global's (PG) massive debt "bringing the value of the deal to \$30 billion."

Paramount Global is controlled by National Amusements, the holding company of the late billionaire Sumner Redstone's (1923-2020) family. There has been speculation for some time that PG is in play [See <u>Pittsburgh Applause</u> January 2024 – ed.] No deal will be possible without the approval of Redstone's primary heir, his daughter Shari.

At press time, there had been no official response from either Paramount Global or National Amusements. <u>The Wrap's</u> Lucas Manfredi reported that PG's shares jumped over 8% after the offer was announced.

Carnegie Museums Gets \$65 Million Gift

Commercial real estate mogul Daniel Kamin, and his wife Carole, have made an astounding \$65 million gift to the **Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh** (CMP). The funds are specifically designated for the Carnegie Science Center, which will be officially renamed the Daniel G. and Carole L. Kamin Science Center.

"This is the largest monetary gift in the history of Carnegie Museums of Pittsburgh—the largest, that is, since the original contribution of our founder Andrew Carnegie," said CMP's Steven Knapp in a press release. "It's extraordinary generosity," Knapp told the <u>*Pittsburgh Post-</u> <u><i>Gazette*'s</u> Joshua Axelrod. "They also share a vision that we are very much a part of. We're just honored to be part of their vision for how they want to build up the city that we all love."</u>



Daniel Kamin runs Kamin Realty Company. The firm was founded in 1916 by his ancestor, Herman Kamin Sr. The company's web site claims that Kamin manages "over 400 properties across 44 states and Puerto Rico, comprising a gross leasable area of over 15 million square feet."

Renner Back On "Mayor"

Jeremy Renner is back in Pittsburgh to shoot a new season of "Mayor of Kingstown," reports several outlets.

"Mayor of Kingstown" is set in a fictional prison town struggling with issues of family, crime, corruption and systemic racism.

Renner was seriously injured in a snowplow accident on New Year's Day 2023. He suffered 30 broken bones and needed to have both his ribcage and face rebuilt. After more than two weeks in intensive care, Renner began a challenging recuperation. The actor kept fans up to date on his progress through social media posts. <u>The Hollywood Reporter's</u> Zoe G. Phillips quotes the actor describing the workload as "arduous" mostly due to the extremely cold weather.

Meanwhile, Denise Petski reports for <u>Deadline</u> that Richard Brake, Denny Love and Paula Malcomson have been added to the cast.

"Mayor of Kingstown" is produced by **101 Studios** for Paramount+ (part of **Paramount Global**). The showrunners are Hugh Dillon and Tayor Sheridan.

Stolen Art Returned

A ceremony was held in Manhattan on January 19 to officially return stolen art --- including one that had been in the Carnegie Museum of Art collection for years.

The piece in question is a 1917 pencil drawing by Austrian artist Egon Schiele (1890-1918). It was part of an impressive collection of works assembled by Austrian cabaret artist Franz "Fritz" Grunbaum (1880-1941). Grunbaum, a Jew, lost his collection to the Nazis and then his life in a concentration camp. Another piece by Schiele, a 1911 watercolor, was also retrieved from a museum at **Oberlin College.**

Carlie Porterfield, writing for <u>The Art Newspaper</u>, explains that "the Grünbaum collection was inventoried by Franz Kieslinger, an art historian who impounded the works into a Nazi-controlled warehouse in 1938. Schiele's work had been declared "degenerate" during the Nazi Party's campaign against Modern art, and much of it was sold abroad in a programme overseen by Joseph Goebbels, the party's head propagandist."

Shiftworks Launched

What was the Pittsburgh Office of Public Art has become its own independent organization, christened as **Shiftworks Community** +**Public Arts**.

The office began in 2005 as a joint project of the city and the **Greater Pittsburgh Arts Council** (GPAC) to provide assistance to public art projects. But its mission needed reviewing as the mayor's office redesigned the city's public art role [See these *Pittsburgh Applause* issues: January 2023 pg 2 / February 2023 pg 3 / March 2023 pg 3 / April 2023 pg 4 – ed.]

These and other changes, writes *Pittsburgh City Paper's* Kahmeela Adams-Friedson, led the office to "to serve additional clients and offer specific services." Spinning off the office was a natural next move. However, executive director Sallyann Kluz told Adams-Friedson, they "needed to have a name and a presence that was more reflective of" the organization's mission.

"We aim to impact not only physical landscapes and cityscapes, but also shift perspectives and expectations for what is possible when artists, communities and organizations work together," Kluz told <u>WESA-FM's</u> Bill O'Driscoll.

Audacy Restructures Debt

The parent company of six Pittsburgh radio stations, **Audacy**, has announced a successful deal to restructure the firm's sizable debt.

What is now Audacy began in 1968 as Entercom Communications Corporation.



Starting in the late 1990's, the company began acquiring other radio station owners. In 2014, Audacy acquired another set of stations for over \$100 million and, in 2017, it merged with CBS' radio division. The company now owns 235 radio stations. But building this media giant came with building a giant debt. According to a company press release: Through the restructuring, Audacy and its debtholders will undertake a deleveraging transaction to equitize approximately \$1.6 billion of funded debt, a reduction of 80% from approximately \$1.9 billion to approximately \$350 million. The Company does not expect any operational impact from the restructuring, and trade and other unsecured creditors will not be impaired."






